### Homework evaluation

#### Objective:

This practice sheet provides you with some essential points that you need to check to evaluate your homework adventure before implementing it with your students.

#### Checklist:

- Make sure that the **mechanisms** of your story are working and creating a coherent path and coherent interactions. If necessary, feel free to use one of the templates provided in this toolbox.
- Besides the mechanisms, you should also check your **scenario** to evaluate whether all the clues, characters and places are relevant to your homework adventure.
- Evaluate the **length** of your text, does it seem too long or too short? Is it suitable for your pupils' motivation and engagement?
- Is the **topic** of your homework adventure clear? Which school subject does it address? Are the **learning objectives** well defined both for you and your students?
- Make sure that you set **clear and achievable goals** for your students, so that they can track their progress in a rewarding way.
- Check **accessibility criteria** to guarantee an accessible content:
  - Have you adapted your **text** in terms of font, size, lining and space ?
  - Have you organised **the space of your paragraphs** by using symbols, colours and icons to separate the different sections and themes?
- Ideally, you should also ask someone else to proofread your homework adventures to notice all the elements that you might have missed.
